Dunn County Locally Developed Transportation Coordination Plan

Purpose

Federal transit law, as amended by SAFETEA-LU, requires that projects selected for funding under the Elderly Individuals and Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310), Job Access and Reverse Commute (JARC)/Wisconsin Employment Transportation Assistance Program (WETAP), and New Freedom programs be “derived from a locally developed, coordinated public transit-human services transportation plan” and that the plan be “developed through a process that includes representatives of public, private, and non-profit transportation and human services providers and participation by members of the public.” This plan is intended to meet this requirement while providing guidance to the county and region in providing and improving specialized transportation services over the next five years.

In 2006, Dunn County developed a coordination plan to meet the then new SAFETEA-LU requirements, prior to the issuance of FTA guidance on the requirement. This process will update the information compiled and the recommendations made in that 2006 process, to bring together six west central Wisconsin counties in an effort to address a regional transportation need, and to prioritize strategies to address this need.

Process

A multi-county meeting, including a broad range of representatives from Barron, Chippewa, Eau Claire, Dunn, St. Croix, and Pierce counties, was held on July 23, 2008, with over 50 persons in attendance. (The meeting invitation letter, invitation list, attendance list, the meeting agenda, and meeting summary are included in Attachments A through E, respectively. The meeting was opened with a discussion of the demographics of the region, including elderly, disabled, and low-income persons, their location and distribution throughout the west central Wisconsin counties. (See county and regional maps in Attachment F.) The coordination process, which was held in 2006, was summarized and service gaps and needs were updated. A wide range of strategies for coordination of services were presented and the group provided input on the need for regional coordination, and developed strategies to pursue on a regional level in the coming years. By county, the attendees updated and addressed strategies that were developed in the 2006 coordination effort and considered the role of their county in a regional effort. Dunn County held a 2nd meeting to finish the details held at DET in Menomonie on August 25th (Attendance List See Attachment G). The final product, this document, is a plan for the individual county, which includes the regional goals and action items, as noted.

Transportation needs and related action recommendations

The participants from Dunn County updated the needs expressed in their 2006 plan and added newly-identified gaps/needs, resulting in the following list, grouped by category, and listing the needs and the recommended actions. The group also developed broad strategies to address the needs, prioritized them, and assigned responsibility, as shown in Table 1.

Working Together

Need:

- Increased flexibility in client-specific programs for more efficient transportation service utilization
- Improved coordination and utilization of existing inventory of vehicles
- Expanded TCC communication to share information with a broader network of providers and decision-makers
- Strategic plan for county-wide and region-wide transportation services
- Improved transportation service coordination throughout the region
- Expand support for improved transportation service coordination
- Increase private sector involvement in improving transportation service coordination
- Centralized dispatch system to reduce duplication of trips
- Increased services for region medical trips
- Increase private sector involvement to improve transportation services

Recommended Actions:

- Increase communication and information sharing between TCC and decision makers and stakeholders
- Encourage all TCC participants to take a more active role in the TCC
- Continue to support and coordinate with the New Freedom initiative and other volunteer voucher and driver programs if funding is available
- Hold monthly public meetings to increase private sector involvement and communication

Data & Evaluation

Need:

- Consolidated inventory of transportation resources and programs that fund transportation
- Better data and evaluation of provider performance
- Ongoing evaluation of transportation service schedules to identify duplication of services, underused assets, and service gaps, as well as tracking needs of target populations
- Communication of performance monitoring and evaluation data to all transportation providers and stakeholders
- Documentation and communication of the benefits of coordination to decision-makers and other stakeholders
- Documentation and distribution of Medicaid statistics
- Improved system efficiency and reporting
- DET will require additional funding for continuing their automated dispatch – currently DOT restricts automated dispatch to a one year lease
- Center for Independent Living for Western Wisconsin, Inc. will need to continue updating lists of service providers for sharing regionally

Recommended Actions:

- Conduct an inventory to document county transportation resources and programs

- Increase efforts to maintain updated vehicle inventories and schedules to more effectively manage the use of existing vehicles
- Inventory and evaluate transportation needs of various target populations to evaluate the effectiveness of existing transportation services
- Evaluate applicable technology applications to improve transportation coordination
- DET is currently using GIS based automated dispatch and billing software and continues to research new technologies. DET will apply for continued funding of leased dispatch/billing software if funds are available
- Center for Independent Living will continue to apply for New Freedom Grants and other available funding to be able to continue providing transportation data collection services
- Expand transportation system performance monitoring and evaluation and communicate the benefits of coordination efforts to decision makers and stakeholders

Customer Service

Need:

- Transportation resource information readily available to riders and resource agencies
- Travel training and consumer education
- Consolidated payment system for county transportation services
- Customer input process with reasonable response times for complaints
- Single contact for information and scheduling of trips
- Consideration of client transportation needs in locating human service offices

Recommended Actions:

- Incorporate all transportation resource information on County website
- Pursue funding sources and partnerships to provide a mobility manager to develop travel training and consumer education programs to improve consumer access to transportation services
- Evaluate options for a consolidated payment system that supports user-friendly services
- Review current customer input practices to develop a standardized policy to both receive and evaluate input and respond to customer concerns and complaints in a timely fashion
- Pursue coordinated marketing efforts through public media sources, whenever practicable

Funding Coordination

Need:

- Improvement of consistency and uniformity of financial data tracked across human service programs
- Consider automated billing applications across agencies, programs, and providers

Recommended Actions:

- Pursue, where applicable technology applications to improve financial data tracking and reporting for uniformity and consistency
- Evaluate appropriate technology and system applications to improve and expand upon automated billing capabilities

Efficient and Effective Services

Need:

- A transportation manager, or broker, to coordinate and manage transportation services
- Integration of agency support services to improve cost-efficiency and management of transportation services

- Consideration of centralized dispatch system to improve the coordination of transportation services between County human service agencies and consumers.
- Co-location of County human service offices to more efficiently serve client transportation needs

Recommended Actions:

- Evaluate the cost-effectiveness of creating a transportation manager position to coordinate and manage countywide transportation services
- Identify agency support services that can lend themselves to improving the provision of transportation services
- Expand participation in TCC
- Evaluate the cost-effectiveness of creating a centralized dispatch system for transportation services, county-wide or region-wide

Dear Friend of Transportation:

As many of you may know, funding under a number of transportation programs - Elderly and Disabled Capital Assistance Program (Section 5310), New Freedom Initiative, Job Access and Reverse Commute (WETAP/JARC) requires that projects be a part of a locally developed coordinated public transit-human services transportation plan. In 2006, county meetings were held to develop the required plans. Since the 2006 meetings, final guidance on coordination has been issued requiring that we meet again.

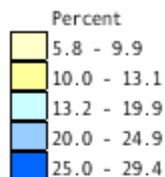

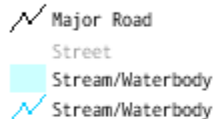
TM-P020. Percent of Persons 65 Years and Over: 2000

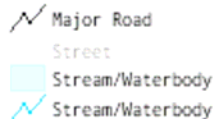
TM-P067. Percent of Persons Below the Poverty Level in 1999: 2000

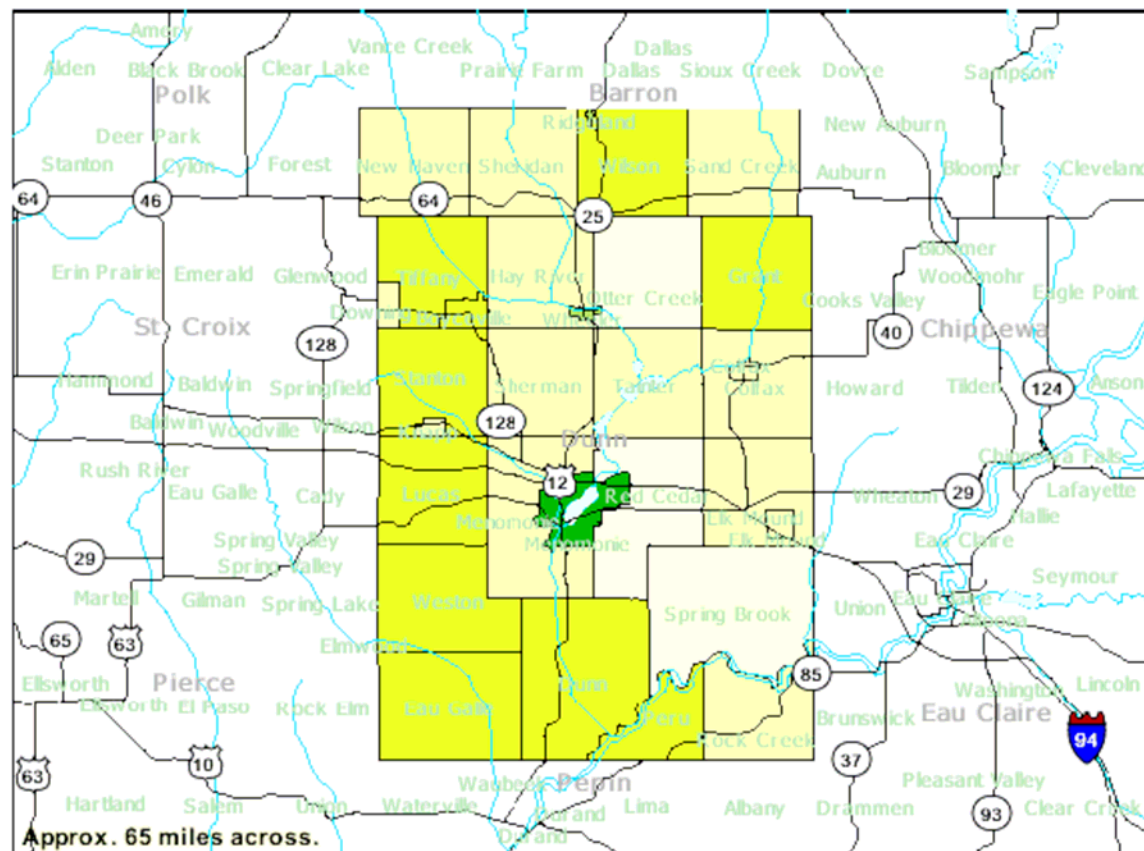
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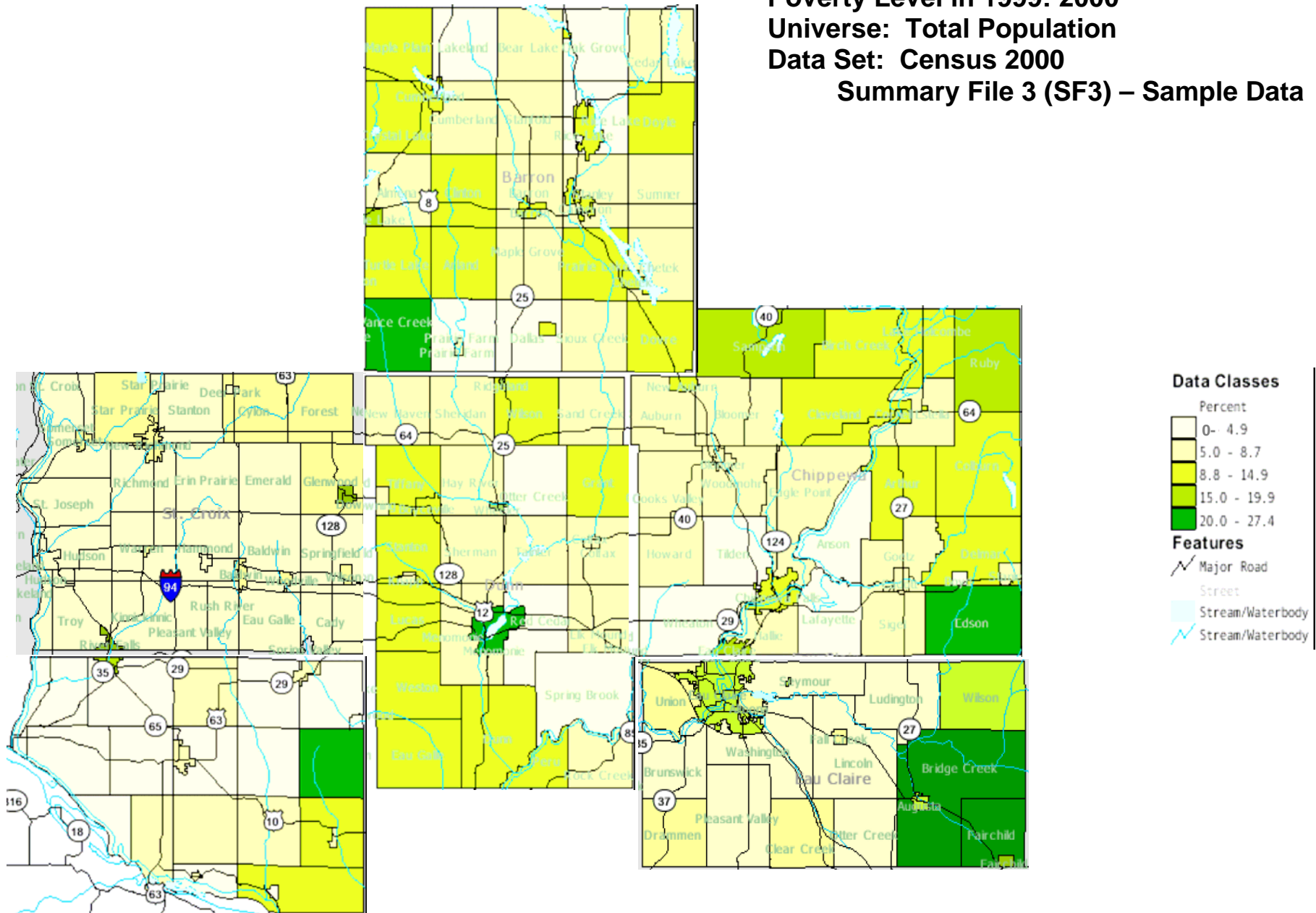

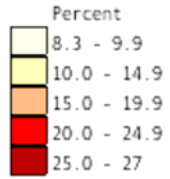
TM-P067. Percent of Persons Below the Poverty Level in 1999: 2000

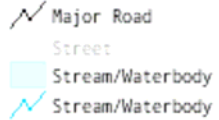
TM-P046. Percent of Persons 21 to 64 Years With a Disability: 2000

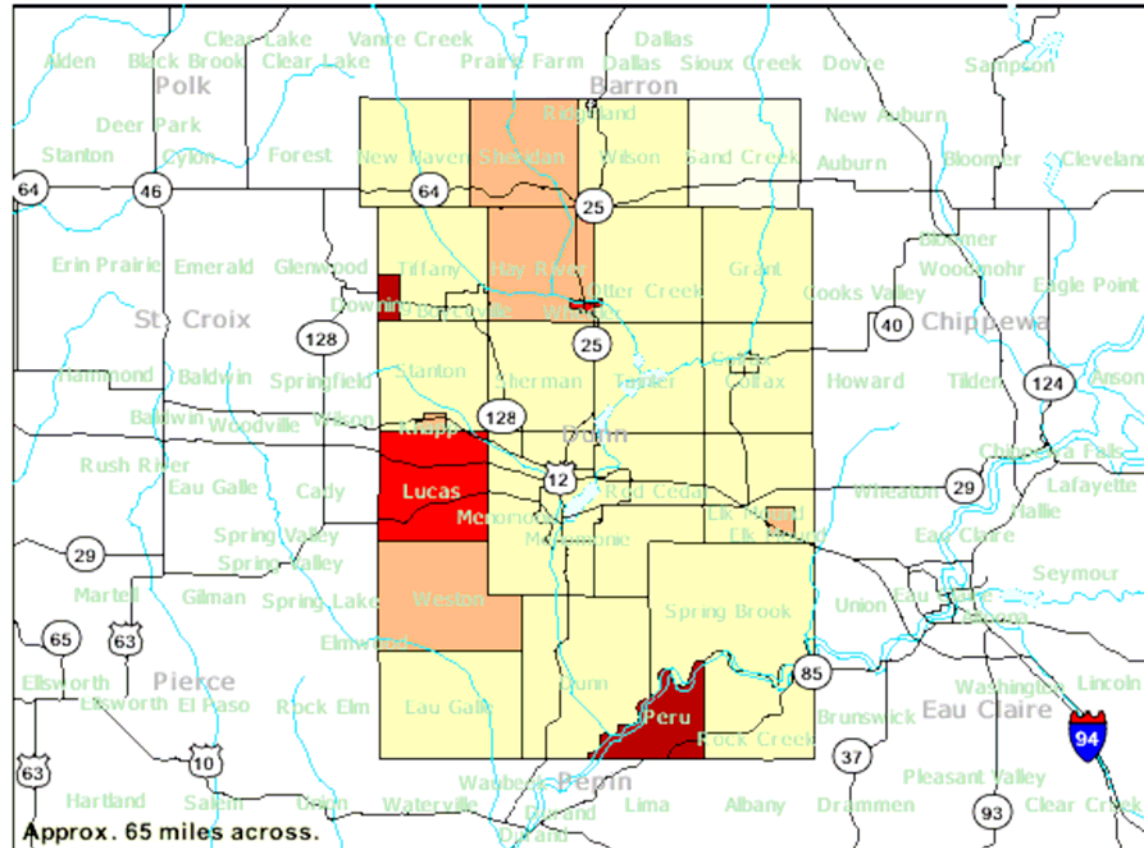

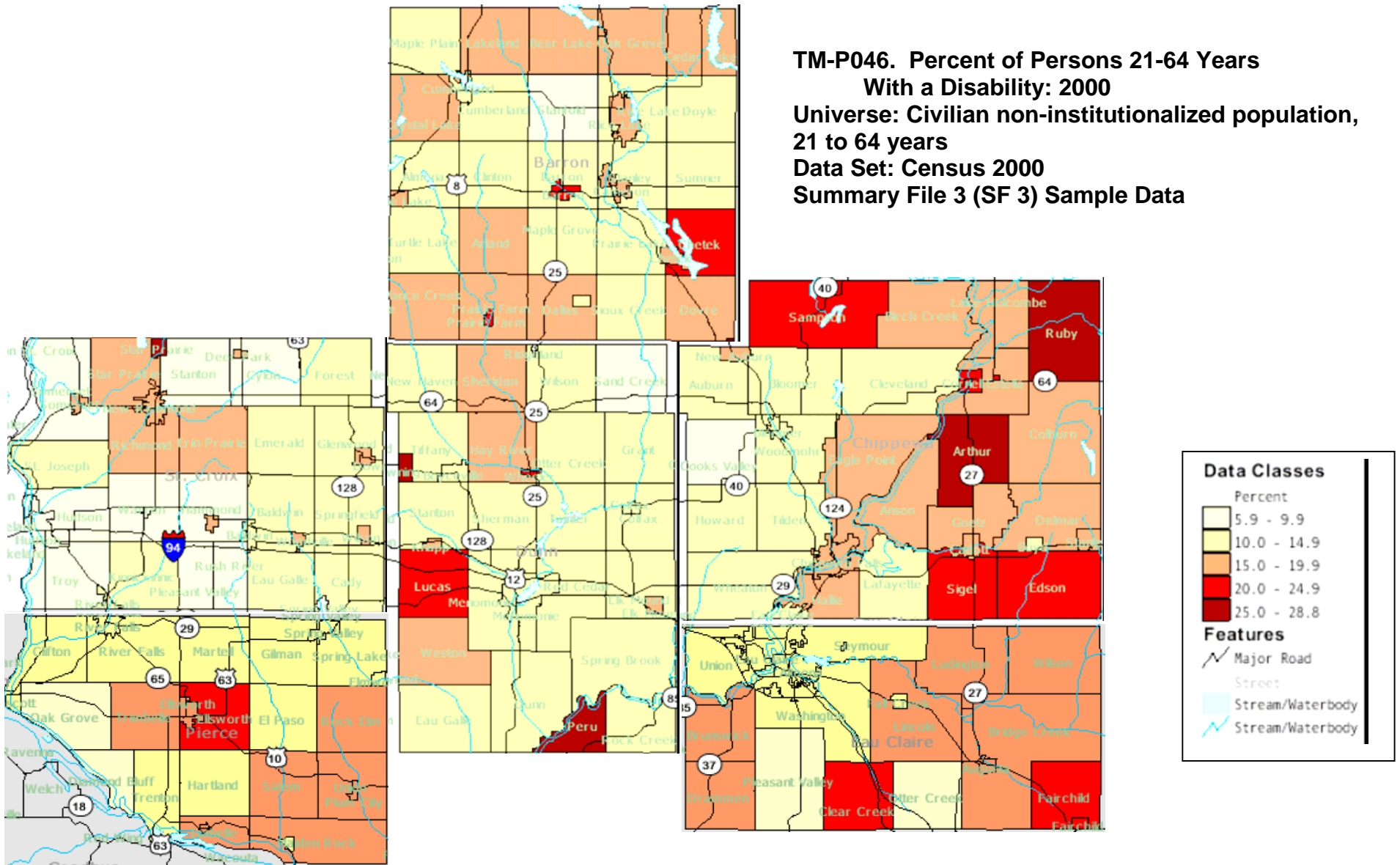
