

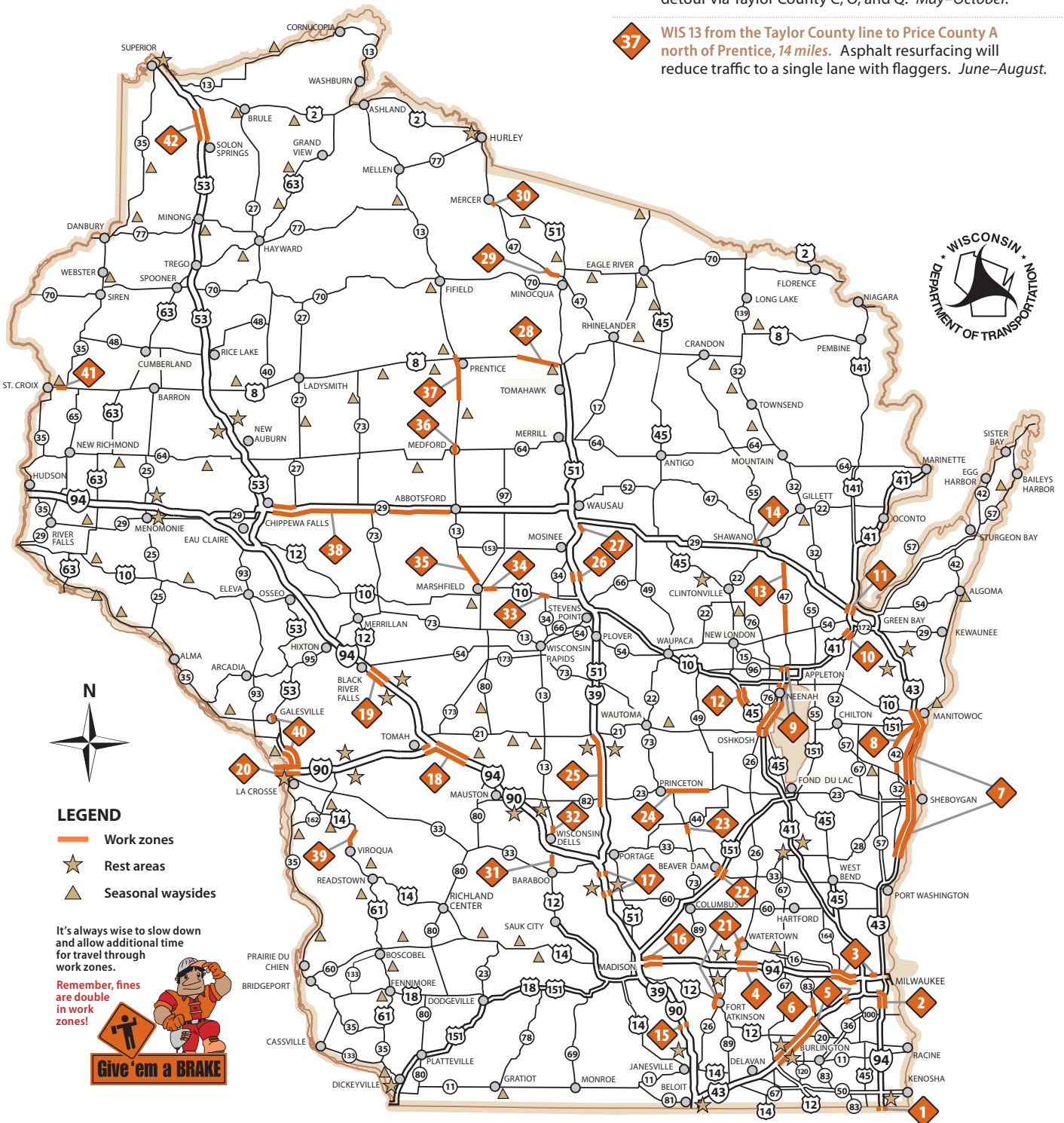
# Major work zones for 2011

Other short-term projects may not be listed.

- 1** I-94 from Russell Road to the Wisconsin state line, 1 mile. Reconstruction of freeway with two lanes open in each direction. Northbound entrance and southbound exit ramps to and from Russell Road will have closures through mid-summer.
- 2** I-43/894 between Loomis Road and I-43/I-894/I-94 Mitchell Interchange, 1.6 miles, and I-94 between College and Howard avenues, 4 miles. Freeway expansion and reconstruction of Mitchell Interchange requires long-term lane restrictions. See detailed panel on other side of this brochure. Through 2012.
- 3** I-94 westbound between North 32nd Street and North 70th Street in Milwaukee County, 2.6 miles, and both directions between 124th Street and WIS 16 in Waukesha County, 9 miles. Repaving of freeway with two lanes open in each direction during peak hours. Occasional lane and ramp closures can be expected. Through fall 2011.
- 4** I-94 from Hillside Drive to WIS 26, 5.7 miles. Repaving of Interstate will use nighttime lane closures between Monday evening and Friday morning and some weekend nights as needed. All lanes open between Friday night and Saturday morning. April–November.
- 5** I-43 between US 12 and Moorland Road in Walworth and Waukesha counties, 29.5 miles, and at Martin Road in Waukesha County, 0.5 mile. Bridge rehabilitation will reduce traffic to one lane during non-peak travel hours between US 12 and WIS 83. Pavement maintenance between US 12 and Moorland Road will require periodic lane restrictions during non-peak hours. April–November. Preparation for bridge replacement at Martin Road in 2012 may require off-peak lane restrictions for shoulder widening. August–2012.
- 6** WIS 83 between Waukesha County NN and WIS 59, 6 miles. Reconstruction will close highway with detour via I-43, WIS 164, and WIS 59. March–November.
- 7** I-43 from south Sheboygan County line to WIS 310 near Manitowoc, 44.9 miles. From the south Sheboygan County line to WIS 42 at Sheboygan, bridge and pavement repairs will reduce traffic to one lane in each direction at various locations. March–November. From WIS 42 to WIS 310 at Manitowoc, expect single lane closures of 2-3 miles in length. All lanes will be open during holiday weekends and special events. June–August.
- 8** WIS 42 from Howards Grove to US 151, 17.9 miles. Pavement repairs and bridge and culvert replacements will close WIS 42 with detour via WIS 42, I-43 and US 151 for part of the time. When not closed, there will be single lane closures. WATCH FOR FLAGGERS. May–October.
- 9** US 41 from WIS 26 at Oshkosh to Breezewood Lane at Neenah, 16 miles, from Winnebago County II to US 10, 0.5 mile, and from College to Wisconsin Avenue at Appleton, 2.5 miles. From WIS 26 to Breezewood, reconstruction and addition of new lane will require 11-foot width restrictions. March–November. From Winnebago County II to US 10, construction of auxiliary lane will require periodic single lane closures. All lanes will be open for special events and holiday periods. July–October. Between College and Wisconsin avenues, lanes will be narrowed for construction of auxiliary lanes. Also, some nighttime lane closures for joint repairs will occur. July–November.
- 10** US 41 from Orange Street to Glory Road including the Scheuring Road Interchange, 4 miles. Pavement, shoulder, and culvert work and bridge replacements at Scheuring Road and Glory Road will require periodic nighttime lane closures. All ramps closed at Scheuring Road Interchange. February–November.
- 11** US 41 at WIS 29, 1 mile. Reconstruction of US 41/WIS 29 Interchange will require periodic nighttime lane closures. April 2011–November 2012.
- 12** US 45 between Winnebago County G and II, 4.6 miles. Freeway conversion will result in single lane closures between 6 a.m. Mondays through noon Fridays. 20-minute full road closures may occur for rock blasting or setting of bridge girders. All lanes open for weekends and holidays. July 2011–September 2012.
- 13** WIS 47 between WIS 54 at Black Creek and WIS 29, 17.4 miles. Paving will reduce traffic to one lane during daylight hours. WATCH FOR FLAGGERS. May–June.
- 14** WIS 22 between WIS 29 and Shawano County B, 0.7 mile. Bridge replacement, grading, and repaving will close highway. Detour via WIS 29 and WIS 47/55. June–November.
- 15** I-39/90 near Edgerton, 1 mile. Bridge work over Lake Drive with two lanes open during peak travel hours. Limited nighttime lane closures. April–October.
- 16** I-94 from the I-39/90/94 Badger Interchange to Dane County N, 5.2 miles. Improvements east of the Badger Interchange will limit traffic to two lanes in each direction and a reduced speed limit of 55 mph. March–November.
- 17** I-39/90/93 at Columbia County CS, 0.6 mile, and approaching and over the Wisconsin River, 2.1 miles. Replacement of bridges within County CS interchange will require periodic rolling stops, daytime and nighttime lane closures, and a short-term detour during off-peak hours when new bridge members are installed. April–November. Approaching the Wisconsin River bridges, there will be lane and shoulder closures in July and August. From September to November, all traffic will be shifted to one side of the median with a 12-foot width restriction. Two lanes will remain open in each direction.

- 18** I-90/94 from Camp Douglas to Tomah, 6.5 miles. Pavement and structure work in the eastbound lane will reduce traffic to one lane in each direction on one side of the median prior to Memorial Day. After Memorial Day, periodic single lane closures from Sunday nights after 7 p.m. through 10 a.m. Thursdays eastbound. Westbound lanes will be open. March–October.
- 19** I-94 between Millston and Black River Falls, 5 miles. Resurfacing will result in single lane closures at night. June–September.
- 20** I-90 from the Minnesota state line to WIS 16, 5 miles. Pavement repair and work on bridges will result in single lane closures from 7 p.m. to 10 a.m. After July 4th–August.
- 21** WIS 26 bypasses at Fort Atkinson, 5.5 miles and at Watertown, 12 miles. Addition of two lanes and a median along the existing WIS 26 Fort Atkinson bypass will require periodic lane closures and flagging operations. Reconstruction of four miles of WIS 26 between Johnson Creek and Watertown will require periodic lane closures and flagging operations as two new lanes are added. Bypass construction around Watertown also will require periodic lane closures and flagging operations. March–November.
- 22** US 151 at Beaver Dam, 5 miles. Pavement and bridge repairs in the southbound lanes will shift all traffic to the northbound lanes with one lane of traffic in each direction. June–2012.
- 23** WIS 73 from the Columbia County line to WIS 44, 4.4 miles. Pavement resurfacing will reduce traffic to one lane during daylight hours. WATCH FOR FLAGGERS. August–November.

- 30** US 51 at Mercer, Beachway Drive to Iron County J, 0.9 mile. Reconstruction of roadway will reduce traffic to a single lane with traffic controlled by temporary traffic signals and flaggers. August–November.
- 31** US 12 between I-90/94 and Baraboo, 7 miles. Construction of Baraboo Bypass. Traffic will use three new roundabouts southbound and two new roundabouts northbound. Watch for construction traffic. April–October.
- 32** WIS 13 from the Columbia County Line to Golden Avenue north of Wisconsin Dells, 2.4 miles. Reconstruction will require 11-foot width restriction. WATCH FOR FLAGGERS. June–November.
- 33** US 10/WIS 34 South intersection, 1 mile. Construction of new interchange at WIS 34 South will require closure of WIS 34 with detour via WIS 66 and Wood/Portage County O. June–October.
- 34** US 10 from WIS 13 to WIS 186, 8.1 miles. Traffic shifts and flagging operations will occur for four-lane expressway construction. April–November.
- 35** WIS 13 between Marshfield and Spencer, from 26th Road to WIS 98, 3.3 miles. Road work will close WIS 13 with detour via WIS 97 and WIS 153 from April through June. WIS 13 will be open to through traffic with no lane or shoulder closures from July 1 through July 17 to accommodate Farm Progress Days traffic. After that, 10-foot width restrictions will be in place. Through September.
- 36** WIS 13 at Medford, 2 miles. Reconstruction will close WIS 13 with detour via Taylor County O, Q, and M. For a short period, WIS 64 will also be closed requiring detour via Taylor County C, O, and Q. May–October.
- 37** WIS 13 from the Taylor County line to Price County A north of Prentice, 14 miles. Asphalt resurfacing will reduce traffic to a single lane with flaggers. June–August.

- 24** WIS 23 east of Princeton, 5.4 miles. Reconstruction of WIS 23 and a short segment of WIS 23/WIS 73 will close the highway. Detour of WIS 23 is via WIS 73, WIS 21, and WIS 49. April–November. Detour of WIS 73 is via WIS 21, WIS 49, Green Lake County A, and WIS 44. April–September.
- 25** I-39 southbound, from WIS 21 to Marquette County D, 21.7 miles. Asphalt resurfacing will cause single lane closures Mondays 6 a.m. through noon Fridays. May–November.
- 26** I-39/US 51 north of Stevens Point, 4 miles. Bridge work will require weekday and non-peak weekend lane closures and periodic full nighttime closures. April–June.
- 27** I-39 northbound south of Wausau, 1.8 mile. Bridge construction and pavement replacement will require 11-foot width restrictions and some lane closures during off-peak travel times. Speed limit reduced to 55 mph. May–November.
- 28** US 8 between McCord Road and Klade Road, 11.6 miles. Asphalt resurfacing will reduce traffic to a single lane. WATCH FOR FLAGGERS. May–June.
- 29** WIS 47 west of Woodruff, Country Lane to West Bolton Lake Lane, 6.7 miles. Asphalt resurfacing will reduce traffic to a single lane. WATCH FOR FLAGGERS. May–June.

- 38** WIS 29 between Chippewa Falls and Abbotsford, 50 miles. Between Chippewa Falls and Cadott, road repairs in the east and westbound lanes will require single lane closures. Between Cadott and Abbotsford, pavement repairs will result in single lane closures in the eastbound lanes only. May–August.
- 39** US 14/61/WIS 27 between Viroqua and Westby, 7 miles. Conversion of an existing 2-lane to a 4-lane divided highway. Watch for construction equipment. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained throughout the project. February–November.
- 40** US 53 at Galesville, 1.1 mile, and between Onalaska and Holmen, 8 miles. Bridge replacement in Galesville will require detour via Trempealeau County TT and T. April–October. Work on bridges between Onalaska and Holmen will result in single lane closures weekdays. May–July.
- 41** US 8 from Glacier Drive in St. Croix Falls to WIS 35, 2.3 miles. Reconstruction of roadway and installation of a roundabout will reduce US 8 to one lane in each direction. April–October.
- 42** US 53 between Solon Springs and Superior, Wisconsin Central Limited Rail crossing to Kent Road, 10 miles. Various road maintenance projects and safety improvements at Douglas County B will result in single lane closures. June–October.
